



**Out of the Woods, into the Fire...**

Pinhooked horses were in high demand yesterday at Keeneland, with seven of the eight top prices on the day coming for horses that had previously sold as either weanlings or as short yearlings in January. Three of the top eight yearlings had something else in common, too: they all hailed from the red-hot consignment of Peter O'Callaghan's Woods Edge Farm.

In total, 10 Woods Edge horses found new homes yesterday, with nine of the 10 bringing more than their weanling prices--some considerably more--a remarkable statistic given the current economic climate.

"We've had a great day. I certainly can't complain," the Irish-bred O'Callaghan said during a break in the action. "We had a nice group of horses that were very highly thought of. There was a lot of veterinary action on them, and they sold accordingly."

O'Callaghan said the vast majority of his horses were purchased as weanlings by the O'Callaghan family, while a few had outside partners, as well. He estimates they bought 25 weanlings to pinhook.

Asked what he typically shops for in a pinhooking prospect, he replied, "We like a nice athletic horse with some scope by nice stallions, like most people do. When you're buying foals, it's not easy. There's a lot of people doing it, and it's hard to get the ones you want. You keep following them in the ring and hope you land a few. But you don't always get the horses you want."

Woods Edge's Saturday consignment included the day's co-second-highest-priced horse, the Stormy Atlantic--Underworld colt ([hip 1310](#)), who went to Mike Ryan for \$350,000.

"He was a very nice, very simple horse," said O'Callaghan. "He was always lovely, and was a very good mover and had a great head. He's out of an Unbridled's Song mare, and seems to have a good mix from both stallions. And people have a lot of respect for Stormy Atlantic."

O'Callaghan and company now have a few days to enjoy their success before getting back to selling Thursday.

"We have a nice Malibu Moon filly and a nice Limehouse filly that should do well," he said.
